

Tooth Numbering Video – Transcript

<u>Time on video</u>	<u>Description</u>
00:08	In this video, we'll discuss the numbering of the permanent teeth.
00:12	To do this, we're going to use the maxillary and mandibular arch models that we used in the previous video.
00:17	Numbering starts in the posterior aspect of quadrant #1.
00:22	Like in many cases, the model is showing that tooth #1 is not present. A given tooth is assigned a tooth number and that tooth number only stays with that tooth. So if a tooth is not present, we skip that number and continue with our numbering.
00:38	So moving up to the next tooth, we have tooth #2, the maxillary right second molar.
00:47	The numbering will continue as we move anteriorly until we get to the midline of the maxillary arch.
00:55	At the maxillary midline in quadrant 1, we have tooth #8 and in quadrant 2, we have tooth #9.
01:05	Going posteriorly in quadrant 2, we come to tooth #15, the maxillary left second molar.
01:16	Tooth #16 in this patient is not present.
01:21	Numbering continues in the mandibular arch, when we start in the posterior aspect of quadrant 3.
01:29	In this patient, tooth #17 is not present, we therefore continue with tooth #18, the mandibular left second molar.
01:41	Again, numbering continues as we move anteriorly, until we reach the midline on the mandibular arch.
01:50	At the midline, in quadrant 3, we have tooth #24. In quadrant 4, we have tooth #25.
02:01	Numbering continues in quadrant 4 as we move more posteriorly, until we reach #31, the mandibular right second molar.
02:12	In this patient, tooth #32, the third molar, is not present.
