

Tooth Lettering Video – Transcript

<u>Time on video</u>	<u>Description</u>
00:04	This video will discuss the lettering of the primary dentition.
00:09	To letter the primary teeth, we will use a stone model that replicates the primary dentition.
00:15	Opening the stone model and laying the maxillary and mandibular arches flat on a table, we'll take a quick look at the quadrants associated with the primary dentition.
00:26	Quadrant 1 is the maxillary right, quadrant 2 is the maxillary left, quadrant 3 is the mandibular left and quadrant 4 is the mandibular right.
00:47	When we do our tooth lettering, we're going to look at quadrant 1 in detail. After looking at quadrant 1, we'll look at quadrants 2, 3 and 4 in less detail.
00:58	Starting in the posterior aspect of quadrant 1, you find letter A, the maxillary right primary second molar. Moving towards the midline, we find letter B, the maxillary right primary first molar. Next we find letter C, the maxillary right primary canine. Then we find letter D, the maxillary right primary lateral incisor. And then at the midline, we find letter E, the maxillary right primary central incisor.
01:40	Once we cross the midline, we are now in quadrant 2. Continuing on in quadrant 2 posteriorly, we come to letter J, the maxillary left primary second molar.
01:54	Lettering continues in the posterior aspect of the mandibular arch. We are now in quadrant 3. The last tooth in quadrant 3 is letter K, the mandibular left primary second molar.
02:09	At the midline on the mandibular arch, we now enter quadrant 4. We continue lettering in quadrant 4 until we reach letter T, the mandibular right primary second molar.
